



**Massimiliano Puglia**  
**Référéndaire of the Court of Justice of the European Union**

Massimiliano Puglia was born in Naples in 1979 where he graduated in Law at Federico II University in 2002. He obtained a Master Degree for Business Lawyers at Bocconi University in Milan in 2003 and, the year after, the LLM in European Law at the “Université Libre de Bruxelles”. In 2004, he has joined the Court of Justice of the European Union where he served for two years as Legal Clerk in the Chambers of Advocate General Tizzano. Since 2006 he is Legal Clerk in the Chambers of Judge Tizzano, President of the First Section of the Court of Justice. He is a qualified lawyer and member of the Naples Bar.

Since 2008, he is regularly publishing notes on the case law of the Court of Justice in “Il Diritto dell’Unione Europea”, the leading Italian legal journal in the field. He is coordinating editor of a thorough Commentary on the European Union Treaties published in 2014 where he also authored the comments to the provisions on the Member States’ accession to and withdrawal from the European Union (Articles 49 and 50 of the Treaty on the European Union). He co-authored a collection of the leading judgments of the Court of Justice, published in 2012. Since 2015, he teaches Procedural Law of the European Union at the University “Sciences Po Lille”. He is a regular speaker at conferences on European Union Law, in particular on State Aids, Consumer Regulation and EU Procedural Law.
